THE PRAYERS OF A BIBLE STUDENT

The 176 verses in Psalm 119 are saturated with prayers that should mark every student of God's word. What follows are 6 petitions the Bible student should regularly pray.

Pray for instruction. A frequent plea of the psalmist is that God would teach him (12, 26, 33, 64, 68, 108, 124, 135). He wants God to be his personal teacher as he assumes the role of a learner and sits at His Master's feet.

Pray for understanding. On several occasions, the author of Psalm 119 asks God to give him understanding (27, 34, 73, 125, 144, 169). He wants more than the accumulation of data. He wants insight and discernment! He wants the skill to utilize biblical knowledge in every day life.

Pray for illumination. The writer wants God to enable him to see the marvelous truths that are in the Scriptures (18). He understands that he is helpless to see these things. God

must perform a divine operation on his eyes that he might see the wonderful and magnificent things that are in the Word of God.

Pray for rejuvenation. A popular request of the psalmist peppered throughout the verses of this psalm is for personal revival. On 9 different occasions, he cries to God "revive me" (25, 37, 40, 88, 107, 149, 154, 156, 159). He wants God to cause him to live.

Pray for application. The one who penned this marvelous psalm prayed to be a doer of the Word (cf. James 1:22). In verse 35, he asked God to make him walk in the path of His commandments. In verse 133, he prayed, "establish my footsteps in Thy word".

Pray for enablement. This lover of God and His word knew he needed the grace of God in his life. So he petitioned God for His amazing grace (17, 58, 124, 132).

These must be the pleas of a Bible student.

HARVEST BANQUET 2008

An annual highlight for the Los Angeles Bible Training School is the Harvest Banquet. Each year an evening is set aside to worship God and to enjoy the fellowship of God's people. Once again this gala event was held at The Proud Bird in Los Angeles.

The highlight of the evening was the proclamation of God's word by Dr. Alex Montoya. The speaker for the evening serves as pastor of First Fundamental Bible Church in Monterey Park, Ca., and also as a professor at The Master's Seminary. Pastor Montoya preached on "The Four Qualities of an Effectual Doer" and based his message on James 1:21-25. The Word of God was richly received.
